## JTG hosts 16 Days campaign In Olifantshoek

The 16 Days campaign of no violence against women and children was held on the 08<sup>th</sup> December in Olifantshoek in the Gamagara Local Municipality. The event was organised by the district municipality and in attendance was Councillors, South African Police Services, the GCIS, Home Affairs, Department of Health and the department of Transport, Safety & Liaison. This year's event was held under the theme "Count Me In: Together Moving a Non-Violent South Africa Forward"

The Executive Mayor made reference to the key messages for this year. The key messages emphasised on change of attitudes, support of the criminal justice system, men leading change, working together with all sectors to fight abuse. The Executive Mayor promised that they will work together with stakeholders to make sure that the rights of women and children are protected. She also encouraged those sectors that are working with women and children to partner with government to eradicate all forms of abuse in the community.
